# **SAFE ROAD HOME**

We are excited to announce that the Shire of Pingelly has successfully secured a grant from the Road Safety Commission for the Safe Road Home project of \$25,300! This funding will be used to install 20 captivating metal artworks creating a loop from Perth along the Brookton Highway via the York-Williams Road to Pingelly, then through to Wandering and out along the Albany Highway back to Perth. This not only provides a drive trail loop, but more importantly, provides a safety message all along the routes from Perth to Pingelly. These metal artworks every 15kms-20kms will serve as a reminder to check your fatigue levels and to take a break. This is important as 70% of road traffic accidents are related to fatigue.

The Safe Road Home project, aims not only to enhance road safety but also to celebrate the rich heritage of our communities. The sculptures will each tell a story/fact related to Pingelly or Wandering, capturing the essence of our people, places, and past.

To bring this project to life, we need your help! We are calling on all community members to share their stories or trivia about Pingelly. Whether it's a memorable person, a significant place, or a fascinating piece of our history, we want to hear from you. Please send your stories or trivia and any related information to Ellen Cook at ellen.cook@pingelly.wa.gov.au Your contributions will not only enrich the project but also ensure that our local heritage is celebrated and remembered for years to come. A few stories for reference:

### Farm Size

"In the 1860's homesteads were typically 40 hectares. Since that time the average farm size has grown to be 100 times that size and are now usually larger than 4,000 hectares. Farmers now can plant more than 120 hectares every day—the equivalent of 3 homesteads!"

## Cross on the hill

"The Cross on the Hill was built after a man had a vision on a 51 foot steel cross to be place on his farm that would over look the town of Pingelly which is illuminated by night symbolising peace and hope."

# **COMMUNITY GARDEN GRANT**


