Community Grants 2019/20

Community Grants have now opened for 2019 and close on Friday 29 March 2019.

This is an excellent opportunity for local community groups, clubs and organisations to secure some funding. All applications must be submitted to the Shire office by 29 March 2019 to be considered. Once all applications are assessed they will be put to Council for consideration in the 2019/20 financial budget. Once this process is completed you will be notified of the outcome in the form of a letter as per the Community Grant Scheme guidelines.



Please note the funding policy guidelines that if your application is successful Council's contribution will generally be limited to one third of the total project value up to \$5,000. Each application needs to outline matching in kind or matching funding to support your application.

Grants are generally paid on submission of receipts and evidence of project completion. This may be varied by prior agreement with Council.

Works Update

- The Parks and Gardens Team have been carrying out town maintenance including a clean-up of leaves and rubbish at the Cemetery.
- Kerbing has been completed in Review Street this week, with backfilling of kerbing programmed for next week. Some additional signage has been ordered as part of Main Roads review of the line marking plan. Line marking will be scheduled by Main Roads when contractors are available. Motorists are advised traffic management will be on site and to follow signage and speed limits set.
- Road reconstruction work on a section of York Williams Road between North Wandering Road and Ulbrich Road has started with clearing of overburden within the road reserve to allow for the road construction. Motorists are advised traffic management will be on site and to follow signage and speed limits set.
- Maintenance grading has been carried out on Thompson, Zig Zag, Merwanga and Napping Pool Roads.
- Engineering staff have installed footings for shade structures being relocated from the old bowling green.
- Maintenance work continuing on CEO residence, proposed date for internal painting is 2 April 2019.
- Road inspection and gravel sampling undertaken on Milton Road in preparation for gavel resheeting planned for July 2019 as part of the proposed Regional Road Group (RRG) capital works program for 2019/20.



Restricted Burning Period

The Prohibited Burning Period finished on on 14 February 2019 and the Restricted Burning Period commenced.

Restricted Burning Period

- 15 February to 29 March (inclusive).
- Permits to burn are required during this period.
- Contact a Fire Control Officer for your respective brigade to obtain the permit required.
- Permit conditions as per the Shire of Pingelly Bush Fire Control Order and must be followed.

Will your child and your neighbours' children be safe while your pool is under construction?

Some types of pools need to be filled with water by the pool builder as part of the construction process. They can also be filled by other means including rain and reticulation. Statistics show that this poses a drowning risk for young children who may access the pool area unsupervised.



Important

The builder is required under occupational safety and health laws to ensure that a suitable barrier is in place while the pool is under construction in order to manage a range of site hazards.

Each owner and occupier is required under building laws to ensure that a compliant pool safety barrier is in place if the pool contains water that is more than 30cm deep.

Speak to your pool builder about how the pool area will be child safe during construction.

Propped open pool gates and faulty latches are a leading cause of drowning deaths in young children.

It only takes seconds for a child to drown, so regularly check that the latch is working and never prop the pool gate open.

Owners and occupiers are responsible for keeping the pool gate closed and maintained.

Remember...



Don't prop the gate open! Keeping it closed will help prevent young children from drowning – a gate that is propped open will not.



Keep the pool gate maintained and make sure it is self-closing and also self-latching.



ALWAYS supervise young children around swimming and spa pools.

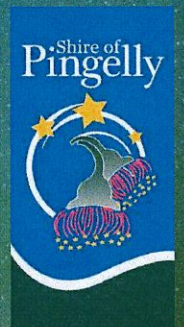
