The Department of Water and Environmental Regulation is seeking public comments on potential waste legislation reforms. They have released an issues paper "Waste Not, Want Not: Valuing Waste as a Resource", which outlines possible reforms to support use of waste-derived materials and Western Australia's move to a circular economy. Comments provided in response to this paper, which can be found on the Department's "Open Consultations" webpage, will inform the legislative direction for waste-derived materials. Works Update



- The Parks and Gardens Team continued their maintenance programs.
- Shoulder maintenance work is scheduled for Wickepin- Pingelly Road commencing on Monday the 24th of June. Work will be between Bullaring and Old Wickepin Road. Motorist are advised traffic management will be onsite and to follow signage and speed limits set.
- The timber bridge structure at Bridge No 3097 on Bullaring Road has been removed. Contractors have poured the concrete base, wing and headwalls. The box culverts have been lifted onto the slab. Earthworks to reinstate the road will commence late next week. The project was scheduled for completion by late-June however due to delays the project will be completed in July. Motorists are advised the gravel side track is open and to follow signage and speed limits set. A lighting tower is being used to illuminate the site at night. This work is fully funded by Main Roads WA for Shires that have a compliant bridge maintenance program.
- A timber deck culvert on the Yealering- Pingelly Road has had some minor repairs to replace broken sleepers with a concrete precast slab.
- A culvert at the intersection of Ryan and North Wandering Road has been unblocked.
- Drainage work to pipe storm water away from the back of the Sensory Garden to Community Place has been completed.
- Traffic hazard signage is in place on Aldersyde Road east of Powell Road to warn motorists of a road failure.
- Winter Maintenance grading work has being carried out on Napping Pool, Woyerling, Albert- Walton and Lamard Road. A section of shoulders on Yearlering- Pingelly Road between Woyerling and Madill has also been graded.
- Storm damage repair work on Jingaring Road has been completed. Five roads on the western side of Pingelly still need drainage repair work done to finalise the WANDRRA claim.
- Minor building maintenance issues resolved.

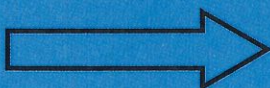
PINGELLY TOWN HALL
